



Procedure for Early Dismissal of Harrisburg Express Service

- At times, the need to dispatch the express bus early may arise, mostly related to early dismissals of major employment centers in Harrisburg or related highway conditions (snow, flooding, etc.).
- If operations receive notification with less than two hours' notice, it will not dispatch a vehicle for early dismissal, with the exception of life threatening emergencies, upon York County Emergency Management's request and/or if in the best interest of the York Adams Transportation Authority.
- If operations receive advance notice of an early dismissal, greater than two hours, we may choose with managerial authorization to send some Express runs early. Notification to the public will be made via rider alerts.
- When operations receive prior day official notification from the Governor's office, Express times may be modified and communicated.
- The last Express bus will operate on its normal schedule, unless extreme circumstances require modifications or cancelation.
- Communication will be conducted through the traditional methods (rider alert, Facebook and website).
- Decision of service modifications are based on what impacts the majority of the passengers. Customers should be reminded of the Emergency Ride Home program should any modifications effect their individual transportation.
- rabbittransit does not modify its schedules for Commonwealth notice of morning start delays.
